Purpose of Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

- A Title I, Part A program is to provide all children with a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education

AND

- To close educational achievement gaps

(ESEA section 1001)

Title I Eligibility

- Title I eligibility for School Year 2022-2023 is based on a minimum poverty threshold of 50.65%, which is determined by the percentage of students qualifying for free and reduced-priced meals.

Requirements for a Title I School

- ***Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA)*** must be conducted at each Title I school in order to gain a better understanding of the strengths and the contributing/root causes of the identified needs.
- ***Title I Schoolwide Plan*** must be written, implemented and monitored by each school. It describes how the school will improve academic achievement by addressing contributing causes of needs identified in the school's CNA. Our school's Comprehensive Academic Plan (CAP) is considered to be the Title I Schoolwide Plan. [Kanu's Schoolwide Plan](#)
- ***Parent and Family Engagement*** activities are to improve student academic achievement and school performance.
