Description

Ka 'Ohā, the virtual and blended division of Kanu o ka `Āina New Century Public Charter School, seeks candidates for the position of 'Ohana Kokua for our virtual and blended program for SY 2024-2025.

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Monitor ongoing student progress in courses and modify learning activities to meet the needs of all learners based on student assessments and personalized learning goals
- Work directly with kumu and 'ohana to ensure that students are meeting state standards and assist with the development of intervention plans for struggling students
- Communicate student progress with students, 'ohana and administration
- Work closely with 'ohana to ensure student success
- Coordinate tutoring sessions with individual students and small groups
- Proctor testing and assist 'ohana with understanding test scores
- Design and lead enrichment workshops for students and parents who are serving as academic coaches
- Attend weekly staff meetings and professional development workshops
- Work collaboratively with Administration and the Ka 'Ohā team
- Work with Ka 'Ohā's and Kanu o Ka Aina's Special Education specialists to help provide access to services for designated students
- Support kumu within virtual and blended instructional models to support student participation
- Some travel required
